5. What motives - stated and implied - does Iago have for taking revenge on Othello?
6. Explain how the symbol of 'hell on earth' as used in *The Duchess of Malfi*.
7. How is romantic love depicted in *Twelfth Night*?
8. What do you mean by "Every man in his *humour*"?

SECTION – C (Prose and Fiction)

9. In *Religio Medici*, Browne's meditation revolves around faith, hope for salvation, and charity. — Discuss.
10. Write a note on the major preoccupations of Donne in "Meditation 17"
11. Briefly summarize the arguments of Abraham Cowley in "Of Agriculture".
12. How does Milton address the issue of 'censorship' in *Areopagitica*?

SECTION – B (Drama)

15. How is Othello's 'race' a factor in the play?
16. Discuss *The Duchess of Malfi* in relation to the revenge play tradition.

SECTION – C (Prose and Fiction)

17. Give an account of Milton's arguments in the opening part of *Areopagitica*.
18. In 'Of Man' [*Leviathan*, Part 1] how does Hobbes begin his study of the human mind?
