6. Prepare a lesson plan to teach simple present tense with the passage given below :

A major part of The Guide is set in Malgudi, a fictional town in South India and a part of it in a village named Mangal. The author has used cinematic techniques of flash back, flash forward and montage in his plot construction. The unconventional plot of the novel revolves freely in time and space, both in between and within the chapters, shifting from the past to the present and back again, and from Malgudi to Mempi hills to Mangal in a random but smooth and logical manner. Raju's presence in Mangal is narrated by the author, while his past in Malgudi is narrated by Raju himself. This technique of double narration, the juxtaposition of the past and the present focuses on the irony of life, the predicament of a man, who is not born 'great' but has 'greatness' thrust upon him. The two locales, two time-frames and two narrators create suspense, arouse the curiosity of the reader and make it a very interesting reading.
